CHAPTER 171.

BE IT ENACTED by the General Assembly of Maryland, That whenever any regiment, squadron or troop of cavalry shall be called into actual service that the governor and council be, and they are hereby anthorised and directed to ascertain and declare whether the whole or what portion thereof shall act and be armed and equiped as mounted infantry, and when the same shall be so ascertained and declared, to furnish cach member thereof with a musket, carbine or rifle and the negessary equipments.
