crop is ripe and may be taken away ; *And provided also,* in case the assessment or valuation of damages made by the commissioners shall be affirmed, the expense attending the said inquisition shall be paid by the person or persons at whose request or for whose benefit it was taken,

4. AND BE IT ENACTED, That the said commissioners as aforesaid, shall be allowed two dollars for every day they shall be employed in discharge of their duty under this act, to be paid in the same manner as the amount of the valuation herein before directed to be made.

CHAPTER 6.

May remove
negroes.

Proviso.

An act further supplementary to an act passed at November Session eighteen hundred and eleven, entitled, "An act authorising Elizabeth Lockett, of Frederick county to remove certain negroes into the state of Maryland."

SEC. 1. BE IT ENACTED by the General Assembly of Maryland, That the said Elizabeth Lockett is hereby authorised and empowering at any time within twelve months after the passage of this act, to remove and bring into this state the negro slaves mentioned and described in the act to which this is further supplementary, or any of them and their issue, according to the terms and provisions of the said original act : *Provided,* that nothing herein contained shall be construed to interfere with, or affect the rights of any person or persons acquired before the passage of this act.

CHAPTER 7.

An act to settle and ascertain the salary of the members of the council for the ensuing year.

SEC. 1. BE IT ENACTED by the General Assembly of Maryland, That each member of the council shall be entitled to receive for the ensuing year, the sum of five hundred and thirty three dollars and thirty three and one third cents, current money for his salary.

CHAPTER 8.

May remove a
negro.

Name to be re-
gistered.

An act authorising Isaac S. Swearingen of Washington county to remove a certain negro boy from the state of Virginia into this state.

SEC. 1. BE IT ENACTED By the General Assembly of Maryland, That the said Isaac S. Swearingen be, and he is hereby authorised and empowered at any time within twelve months after the passage of this act, to remove and bring into this state, a certain negro boy named Dennis, that he now has a bona fide absolute right unto, in the same manner that he might or could have done at the time of his own removal into this state, any law to the contrary notwithstanding.
