

sioners, or a majority of them shall value and ascertain the damages that may be sustained by each and every of the persons, through or on whose lands the said road may pass (petitioners to the general assembly for this road only excepted) by opening the same, and the damages so ascertained shall be levied and assessed as other county charges are, and shall be paid over to the said persons respectively over whose land said road may pass.

4. AND BE IT ENACTED, That the said commissioners before they proceed to act, shall take an oath before some justice of the peace, that they will, without favor or affection, prejudice or partiality, assess the damages sustained by the person or persons through whose lands the said road may pass, by reason of opening the same.

5. AND BE IT ENACTED, That the said commissioners respectively, when named by the levy court as aforesaid, shall be entitled to receive two dollars for every day they shall severally attend to discharge the duties required by this act, which is hereby directed to be levied, collected and paid, as other county charges are levied, collected and paid.

CHAPTER 99.

An act for the payment of the Journal of Accounts.

WHEREAS it appears by the journal of accounts of this session, that there is due from this state the sum of twenty seven thousand two hundred and fifty four dollars; Therefore,

Preamble.

Sec. 1. BE IT ENACTED by the General Assembly of Maryland, That the treasurer of the western shore be and he is hereby authorised and required to pay the several persons, their executors, administrators, assigns or orders, or to such of them as shall offer to receive the same, the several sums of current money allowed to them respectively as they appear to be settled and ascertained by the said journal of accounts, out of money now in the treasury or that shall come into the treasury, subject to the appropriation of the general assembly.

CHAPTER 100.

A further supplement to the act entitled, "An act for opening and extending Aisquith-street in the eastern precincts of Baltimore."

Passed Jan 28
1815.

SEC. 1. BE IT ENACTED by the General Assembly of Maryland, That the collector of taxes of the city of Baltimore, for the time being, shall have authority to collect by distress or otherwise, from all persons chargeable therewith, their respective proportions of the damage for opening and extending said street, as ascertained by the commissioners appointed by the mayor of said city, in virtue of the supplement, passed at the last ses-
