An act to incorporate the Members of the Library Company of Emmitsburg in Fred rick county.

Sec. 1. BEIT ENACIED by the General Assembly of Maryland, That Robert S. Annan, James Moor, Lewis Wever, Patrick Reid, John Troxal, jun William W. Paterson, John Smith, Michael Row, James Hughes, William Long, Jacob Troxai, A. Munro, Andrew Smith, Benjamin Ogle, (of James,) and John Boner, and such other persons as they may hereafter admit into their company, agreeably to such rules and by-laws as they may establish for the beneficial and orderly manage. ment of their institution, shall be, and they, and their successors and assigns are hereby declared to be one commonity, corporation and body politic, forever hereafter by the name and style of the Library Company of Emmitisburg, and by that name they shall be and are hereby made able and capable in law to have, purchase, receive, possess, enjoy and retain to them and their succosors, lands, tenements, rents, annuities, pensions, and other hereditaments, in fee simple, for a term of years, life, lives or otherwise, and also goods, chattels and effects, of what nature, kind or quality soever, and the same to grant, demise, alien or dispose of, and by the name aforesaid, so to do and execute all other things touching the same; Provided, That the clear yearly value of the real estate of said corporation, exclusive of any house which they may hereafter possess for the keeping the books, maps and other effects of the company ex-
