Passed Feb. An act authorising Alexander Johnson late sher ff and collector of Charles county, to complete his collection. SEC. 1. BE IT ENACTED by the General Assembly of Maryland, That the said Alexander Johnson, he and he is hereby authorised to collect until the first day of January, eighteen hundred and sixteen, an bar nees due him as sheriff and collector of Charles county, in the same manner as he could or might have done within the time limited by law, any law to the courary not with standing.

2. AND BE IT ENACTED, That it shall be the duty of the said Alexander Jonnson, before here ceeds to execute or distrain the property of any person or persons for taxes, officer's fees or public dues, in virtue of this act, to deliver to, or teave at the last place or abode of such person or persons, his, her or their executors or administrators, chargeable with the same, at least thirty days previous to the levying such execution or distress, an account written in words at full length, of the taxes, officer's fees or public dues, demanded of him, her or them, with an affidavit annexed thereto, that he half not recived any part thereof, nor any thing as security or satisfaction for the same, more than credit given, to the best of his knowledge.
