No. 28.

Resolved, That the treasurer of the Western Shore pay to Lieut. Col. William Potter, or order the sum of one hundred and twelve dollars seventy-two and an half cents, out of any unappropriated money in the treasury, in order to re-imburse him the sum advanced for the maintenance of twenty-two deserters from the British navy, agreeably to the order of Brig. Gen. Benson.

No. 29.

Resolved, That the treasurer of the Western Shore be, and he is hereby directed to pay out of any unappropriated money in the treasury to Jacob Gibson, the sum of eighty-four dollars and fifty cents, as a compensation for his trouble and expense in transporting two six pound cannon from Baltimore to St. Michaels, some time in the month of May, in the year eighteen hundred and thirteen.

No. 30.

Resolved, That the treasurer of the Western Shore pay to Caleb Steuart, door-keeper of the house of delegates, the sum of sixty dollars, and to Henry Thompson, messenger to the senate, the sum of fifty dollars, as a compensation for their services in taking care of the furniture of their respective rooms in the recess of the general assembly.

No. 31.

Resolved, That the governor and council be, and they are hereby authorised to establish from time to time, such rules and regulations for the recruiting service, for the troops authorised to be raised by an act entitled, an act to provide for the better defence of the state, and to prevent the necessity of frequent calls of the militia as they shall judge proper and that the bounty for every non-commissioned officer, musician or private who shall enlist in the said troops, shall be fifty dollars, to be paid at the time of enlistment.

Resolved, That for the bounties and other necessary expenses attending the raising of said troops, there shall be appropriated the sum of three hundred thousand dollars, to be paid by the treasurer of the Western Shore out of any unappropriated money in the treasury.
