Dec. Ses. 1816. may be sustained by individuals through whose lands the said road may pass, taking into consideration the advantages and disadvantages, and return the same to the levy court of said county, together with the plot and certificate as above directed; and the damages so ascertained shall be levied and collected as other county charges in said county are, and shall be paid over to the persons entitled to receive the same; Provided nevertheless, that Proviso. no money shall be levied or assessed for the purpose of paying the lamages aforesaid until the said road shall be opened and clear-

ed agreeably to the provisions of this act,

Commissioners allowance.

And be it enacted, That the said commissioners shall be catitled to receive as a compensation for their services in performing the duties required by this act, the sum of two dollars per day, to be levied, collected and paid, in the same manner as other coupty charges in said county.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland, That so much of the act, entitled, An act to encourage the destruction of crows in the several counties therein mentioned, passed at November session, eighteen hundred nine, chapter 204. as relates to Queen-Anne's county, and the same is hereby refleated.

Passed Jan. 14. An act to allow William Waller, late Sheriff and Collector of Somerset County, further time to complete his Collection.

Sec. 1. Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland, Time for col- That William Waller, late sheriff and collector of Somersel county, be and he is hereby authorised and empowered to collect, until the first day of January, one thousand eight hundred and eighteen, all balances due him as sheriff or collector of Somerset county, in the same manner which he could or might have done within the time limited by law.

To deliver an execution.

2. Be it enacted, That it shall be the duty of the said Wilaccount before liam Waller, before he proceeds to execute or distrain the property of any person or persons for taxes, public dues or officers ides, in virtue of this act, to deliver to such person or persons chargeable with the same, at least thirty days previous to the levying such execution or distress, an account, written in words in full length, of the taxes, public dues or officers fees, demanded of him, her or them, with an affidavit annexed thereto, that he hath not received any part thereof, nor any thing in security or satisfaction for the same, more than credit given, to the best of his knowledge.
