CHAPTER 171.

A Supplement to an act, entitled, An act to establish a Passed Feb 9 1819 Bank, and incorporate a Company, under the title of The

Be it enacted, by the General Assembly of Maryland, That how to be mathe concerns of the Planters Bank of Prince-George's county naged. shall be managed by twelve directors, and a president, the directors to be chosen annually by the stockholders, and the president chosen by the directors at their first meeting after their annual election, two of which said directors shall go out annually, and two more be chosen to supply their places; and all elections shall Proving be by ballot; Provided always, that the president shall be re-eligible, and if chosen out of the number of directors, his place shall be supplied by the directors from among the stockholders.
