

# RESOLUTIONS.

1818.

**RESOLVED**, That the governor and council be requested to direct the attorney-general to prosecute any remedy which the state may have against the said bank to secure itself from loss in the aforesaid transaction.

**No. 37.**

**RESOLVED**, That the treasurer of the western shore pay to general Charles Ridgely of Hampton, late governor of Maryland, or to his order, the sum of one hundred and eighty-two dollars, it being the amount paid by him over and above the appropriation that was made at December session 1815, for furnishing the government house) as appears by his general account and vouchers, forwarded to the general assembly at its present session.

**No. 38.**

**RESOLVED**, That the treasurers of the eastern and western shore, be and they are hereby directed, to proceed in the collection of the debts due to the state from individuals, banks and counties, of their respective shores, as provided by law, and to cause suits to be brought for the same, whenever it may be necessary and thought available to do so, and to report annually to the legislature the progress of such suits, and the situation of all such suits.

**No. 39.**

**RESOLVED**, That the treasurer of the western shore be and he is, hereby authorised and required, to pay Richard Loockerman, late auditor, the salary allowed him by law up to the time the present auditor shall qualify and commence the discharge of his duties as such.

**No. 40.**

**RESOLVED**, That the treasurer of the western shore pay to Cornelius Mills, sergeant at arms, the sum of thirty dollars; to John Sullivan, door keeper to the house of delegates, the sum of thirty dollars; to Gottlieb Grammer, messenger to the senate, the sum of thirty dollars; to Henry Coulter, door keeper to the senate, the sum of thirty dollars, for taking care of the furniture of their respective rooms.

**No. 41.**

**RESOLVED**, That the treasurer of the western shore, pay quarterly, each and every year, unto Joseph Cresap, a sum of money equal to the half pay of a lieutenant, during his life, as a further compensation for his services during the revolutionary war.

**No. 42.**

**RESOLVED**, That the treasurer of the western shore pay to Charles Sewell, or order, the amount of his bond to the state, bearing date the 16th day of July 1804, with interest, out of any unappropriated money in the treasury.

**No. 43.**

**RESOLVED**, That the governor be, and he is, hereby authorised to draw on the treasurer of the western shore, in favour of the paymaster of the 23d regiment of Maryland militia, for the amount ascertained due to the officers and men of said regiment, for services performed during the late war, by the clerk of the council, according to the vouchers exhibited.

**No. 44.**

**RESOLVED**, That the treasurer of the western shore pay to the order of the governor any sum of money not exceeding the sum of two thousand dollars, for the purpose of repairing the government house, to be expended under his direction.

**No. 45.**

**RESOLVED**, That colonel Thomas Ennals and Henry Hicks, of Denwood, of Dorchester county, be and they are appointed commissioners, and are hereby authorised and directed, to enquire whether there be now living any of the Indians to whose use were reserved certain portions of the Choptank Indian lands, or to whom were granted annuities, and to report their proceedings to the next general assembly.

**No. 46.**

**RESOLVED**, That the governor and council be and they are hereby authorised and requested, to procure the Digests of the Laws of those states and territories of the United States which have not been procured, and to pay for the same out of any unappropriated money in the treasury.

**No. 47.**

**RESOLVED**, That the governor be and he is, hereby authorised and requested, to purchase five copies of Seybert's Statistical Annals of the United States, and pay for the same by an order on the treasurer of the western shore, which copies shall be distributed as follows; three for the use of the house of delegates, one for the senate, and one for the executive.
