Passed Feb 19 1819

RESOLVED, That the treasurer of the western shore be and he is hereby authorised, to pay annually, in quarterly payments, to Bennet Mudd, of Charles county, an old soldier; or his order, the half pay of a sergeant during the remainder of his life.

RESOLVED, That the treasurer of the western shore be, and he is hereby directed, to pay unto Reuben Moore, of Dorchester county, late a private in the revolutionary war, or to his order, annually, in quarterly payments, a sum of money equal to the half pay of a private, as a further remuneration for his services during the revolutionary war.

RESOLVED, That the treasurer of the western shore be and he is hereby directed, to pay unto William Wall, of Dorchester county, an old soldier, or to his order, annually, in quarterly payments, a sum of money equal to the half pay of a private, as further remuneration for his services during the revolutionary war.
