

warehouse, and keeping the same in repair, and for the providing CHAP. 143.
 proper screws, beams, scales, weights, brands and marking irons,
 and all other things necessary for the inspecting of tobacco, and
 for the payment of the salary or salaries to the inspector or in-
 spectors, as the proprietor or proprietors of the said warehouse
 shall agree to pay; and if any tobacco shall remain in the said
 warehouse above one year after inspection, the proprietor or pro-
 prietors of such warehouse may demand, and shall be entitled to
 receive, the further sum of twelve and a half cents on each hogs-
 head so remaining for every month thereafter.

3. *And be it enacted,* That the justices of the levy court of Anne-
 Arundel county, or a majority of them, shall, when the said ware-
 house shall be erected and finished, and ready for the reception
 and inspection of tobacco, nominate and recommend in writing, to
 the governor and council, two, or if required by the proprietor or
 proprietors of said warehouse, three persons, one of whom the go-
 vernor and council are authorised and required to appoint and com-
 mission as inspector of said warehouse, in the manner directed by
 the act, entitled, "An act to regulate the inspection of tobacco,"
 passed at November session eighteen hundred and one.

When house is ready for inspection to nominate persons as inspectors

4. *And be it enacted,* That the said warehouse, when erected,
 shall be in all respects under the same regulations as other public
 warehouses for the inspection of tobacco in this state, except where
 it is otherwise provided by this act; and the inspector of the said
 warehouse, when appointed, shall qualify and give bond, and be
 subject in every respect to the regulations established by the said
 act, entitled, An act to regulate the inspection of tobacco, as if
 the said warehouse had been established by the said act, except
 where it is otherwise herein provided.

To be under same regulations as other warehouses

5. *And be it enacted,* That every inspector appointed, and acting
 as such, at said warehouse, shall account quarterly, (or oftener if
 required,) with the proprietor or proprietors of the said warehouse,
 for all money by him received for the inspection of tobacco; and
 shall pay the same quarterly, and if required, shall give bond,
 with security, to such proprietor or proprietors, to account and pay
 as by this act is required.

CHAP. CXLIV.

An act relating to the Chancery Court, Court of Appeals, the County and Or-
 phans Courts, and for other purposes. Passed Feb 10 1820

1. *Be it enacted, by the General Assembly of Maryland,* That in all
 cases in which the court of chancery, the county and orphans court,
 are authorised to order an investment in the funds, that they shall
 be and are hereby authorised to order and direct that the same be
 loaned out on real or such other security as they may approve, pro-
 vided that the chancery or judges of the said courts shall deem
 the same most advantageous for the interest of the parties.

In cases where courts are authorised to order an investment in the funds, they may direct the same to be loaned out, &c.

2. *And be it enacted,* That the provisions of the act of eighteen
 hundred and sixteen, chapter one hundred and fifty-four, respect-
 ing the sales of real estate of minors, be extended to personal estate
 of such minors.

Provisions of act of 1816 extended to personal estate.

3. *And be it enacted,* That the provisions of the act of eighteen
 hundred and seventeen, chapter one hundred and thirty-nine, en-
 titled, An act to provide for the conveyance and return of process
 issued from the courts of one county to the officers of another, be
