## CHAP. LXXXVII.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland, That the Proceedings made proceedings of the commissioners appointed by Dorchester county court to make division of the lands and tenements of Doctor Daniel Sullivan, late of the same county, deceased, be and the same are hereby made valid and effectual to every intent and purpose whatsoever, in as full and ample manner as if the same had been in all respects according to law.
