RESOLVED, That the governor, by and with the not and consent of the Passed Feb 16 conneil of this state, shall appoint two commistered to meet such commistered Pour Bioners as may be appointed on the part of the state of Virginia, whose duty it shall be to examine into and report the state of the navigation of the Potomac river, and its branches, and to inquire into and report the situation and consition of the affairs of the Potomac Company; the amount and character of its seceipts and expenditures, and to advise and consult with the commissioners on the part of the state of Virginia, as to the measures most advisable to be recommended to, and conjugatly adopted by the said states, either for giving aid

to the said company in the further prosecution of the said work, or for the more effectual improvement, of the navigation of the said river, by such other means as may be deemed most expedient.
