Ses. 1821. satisfied by the certificate of the orphans' court that the said debt for which indulgence is prayed is well and sufficiently secured, and upon such securities paying six per cent interest and all costs due thereon, to stay any further proceedings against such securities until the first day of January eighteen hundred and twenty-three; *Provided*, That any judgments upon which proceedings may be stayed as aforesaid shall continue and remain in full force, and executions may be issued at any time within twelve months after the expiration of such stays.
- Passed Feb 20, 1822. **No. 36.**
 In favor of Elizabeth Isabell. **RESOLVED**, That the treasurer of the western shore be and he is hereby directed to pay to Elizabeth Isabell of the city of Annapolis, or to her order for life, annually, in quarterly payments, a sum of money equal to the half pay of a sergeant as a further compensation for services rendered by her husband during the revolutionary war.
- Passed Feb 20, 1822. **No. 37.**
 In favor of Joseph Thomas. **RESOLVED**, That the treasurer of the western shore pay to Frisby Henderson, Esq or his order, of Cecil county, as trustee for Joseph Thomas, an old revolutionary soldier, in quarterly payments during his life, the half pay of a private, as a further remuneration for his services during the revolutionary war, and that the trustee pay to the said Joseph Thomas the amount so received in such manner as the said trustee shall think most advantageous for said Thomas' support.

 In favor of the Printer to the state. **RESOLVED**, That the printer of the state be allowed thirty days in addition to the time limited by law for printing the laws and votes and proceedings of the present session.
- Passed Feb 22, 1822. **No. 39.**
 In favor of John Quynn & Andrew Slicer. **RESOLVED**, That the treasurer of the western shore pay to John Quynn, door-keeper to the house of Delegates, the sum of sixty-dollars; to Andrew Slicer, messenger to the senate, the sum of sixty dollars, for taking care of the furniture of their respective rooms during the recess of the legislature.
- Passed Feb 22, 1822. **No. 40.**
 In favor of Henry Darden. **RESOLVED**, That all further proceedings on a judgment against Henry Darden, one of the securities of William Chambers, be suspended until the twentieth day of December next; *Provided*, That the said Henry Darden shall pay to the treasurer of the eastern shore, on or before the fifteenth day of May next, one third part of the interest and costs due on the whole amount of the claim against the said William Chambers and his securities.
- Passed Feb 22, 1822. **No. 41.**
 In favor of Wm. Sewell. **RESOLVED**, That the treasurer of the western shore be and he is hereby directed to pay to William Sewell, of Talbot county, or to his order, during life, in quarterly payments, a sum of money equal to the half pay of a private, as a further compensation for those services rendered by him during the revolutionary war.
- Passed Feb 22, 1822. **No. 42.**
 In favor of Sarah Windham. **RESOLVED**, That the treasurer of the western shore be and he is hereby directed to pay to Sarah Wyndham of the city of Annapolis, or to her order for life annually, in quarterly payments, a sum of money equal to the half pay of a sergeant, as a further compensation for services rendered by her husband during the revolutionary war.
- Passed Feb 22, 1822. **No. 43.**
 In favor of Joshua Guyton. **Resolved** That the treasurer of the western shore, be and he is hereby required to credit the account of Joshua Guyton, Esq. late sheriff of Harford county, with the sum of two thousand dollars, the full amount of the forfeited recognizances of Anthony Asher, Bernet Asher, Aby Asher and Richard Grimes, which he the said Joshua Guyton stands charged with on the treasurer's books, and that the said Joshua Guyton be, and he is hereby released from the full amount of the forfeited recognizances of the aforesaid four persons, any law or resolution to the contrary notwithstanding.
- Passed Feb 22, 1822. **No. 44.**
 In favor of John C. Hull. **Resolved**, By the General Assembly of Maryland, That the treasurer of the western shore is hereby directed to dismiss the suit as instituted by this state against the said John C. Hull and his securities, and to cancel the said bond, upon the said Hull executing a release for all his interest in the said land.
- Passed Feb 22, 1822. **No. 45.**
 In favor of Benjamin Uncles. **Resolved**, That the treasurer of the western shore, be and he is hereby directed to pay to Benjamin Uncles, of Anne Arundel county, or to his order, annually for life, in quarterly payments, a sum of money equal to the half pay of a private, as a further compensation for his services during the revolutionary war.
