CHAPTER 119.

An act for the support of Martha Conner, the idiot daughter of James Conner, of Kent county. Passed Feb. 6, 1823.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland, That the levy court of Kent county be, and they are hereby authorised and empowered to levy on the assessable property of said county, so long as they shall see cause, a sum of money not exceeding thirty dollars, for the support and maintenance of Martha Conner, the idiot daughter of James Conner, of said county, and that the same when so levied shall be collected by the collector of said county, and by him paid annually to the said James Conner or to his order. Levy \$30.

CHAPTER 120.

An act authorising John Cole, of Frederick county, to remove his negro slave "James," from the state of Virginia into this state. Passed Feb. 6, 1823.

Section 1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland,* That the said John Cole be, and he is hereby authorised and empowered, at any time within twelve months after the passage of this act, to remove and bring into this state, his negro man, James, in the same manner as he might or could have done at the time of his own removal into this state, any law to the contrary thereof in anywise notwithstanding. Import a slave.

2. *And be it enacted,* That the said John Cole register the said negro in the clerk's office for Frederick county court, in the same manner as he by law would have been compelled to do, had he have brought the said negro into this state, within one year after his removal from Virginia to this state. Register.

3. *And be it enacted,* That nothing herein contained shall be construed to enable the said John Cole to sell or dispose of said negro man, James, within the term of three years after the passage of this act. Prohibited to sell.

CHAPTER 121.

An act for the relief of the Poor of Prince-George's County, being Supplementary to the act entitled, An act, for the relief of the poor of the several counties in this state. Passed Feb. 7, 1823.

Section 1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland,* That the office of the present trustees of the poor for Prince George's county, shall cease and be at an end on the first Monday of June next, and that the appointment of trustees of the poor of said county from and after the first Monday in April next, be vested in the levy court of said county. Trustees.

2. *And be it enacted,* That the levy court of Prince George's county, be, and they are hereby authorised and required, at their meeting in May next, and at their first meeting in the month of May forever thereafter to appoint seven discreet and proper persons qualified agreeably to the provisions of the original act, to which this is a supplementary act, and of this act, to be trustees for the poor of said county. Annual appointment.

3. *And be it enacted,* That it shall be the duty of the clerk of said levy court, within five days after such appointment, and within the like time of any future appointments, to be made in virtue of Notification, &c.
