

# LAWS OF MARYLAND.



## MARYLAND, SC.

At a Session of the General Assembly of Maryland, begun and held at the City of Annapolis, on the first Monday of December, being the first day of the said month, in the year of our Lord, 1823; and ending on the 26th day of February, in the year 1824. his excellency Samuel Stevens, Jr. Esq. Governor, the following laws were enacted, to wit:

### CHAPTER 1.

An Act for the relief of Greenbury L. Raleigh, of Dorchester county.

WHEREAS, It has been represented to this General Assembly, by the petition of Greenbury L. Raleigh, of Dorchester county, that he is now confined in the Jail of said county for debt, that he has applied to the Judges of Dorchester county court for the benefit of the several acts of Assembly, passed for the relief of insolvent debtors, and that the benefit of said acts has been withheld from him, as he has not resided in the state of Maryland two years previous to his application, Therefore,

*Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland;* That any judge of Dorchester county court, or any justice of the orphans' court of said county be, and he is hereby authorised and empowered to grant to Greenbury L. Raleigh, of said county, the benefit of the several acts of Assembly, passed for the relief of insolvent debtors: *Provided,* the said Raleigh shall in all respects, (except that of residence) comply with the requisition of said acts of Assembly; and that he satisfy the said judge or justice that he did not come into this state with the view of obtaining the benefit of the said insolvent laws.

### CHAPTER 2.

An Act for the benefit of Anna Boyd, wife of James P. Boyd, of the city of Baltimore.

*Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland,* That Anna Boyd, wife of James P. Boyd, of the city of Baltimore be, and she is hereby authorised and empowered in the same manner as if she were a *feme sole* and unmarried, to take into her possession and have the sole control and management of all the real estate devised to her by James McHenry, her deceased father, and to institute any proceeding at law or in equity for the purpose of causing a partition to be made of the said estate or of any part thereof, and for obtaining possession thereof; and also to make any disposition of the said estate, or of any part thereof, by sales or otherwise, and to make and execute any conveyance, lease or other instrument of writing touching and concerning the said estate, and that all contracts, engagements, conveyances and leases by her entered into, in and about the said real estate, shall be binding and obligatory on her and all persons concerned, and shall be enforced in law or equity in the same manner as if she were a *feme sole*
