CHAPTER 212.

An act for the payment of the Journal of Accounts.

WHEREAS, it appears by the journal of accounts this session that there is due from this state the sum of forty-three thousand two hundred and thirteen dollars and fifty-nine cents.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland, That the Treasurer of the Western Shore, be, and he is hereby authorised and required to pay the several persons, their executors, administrators, assigns or orders, or to such of them as shall offer to receive the same, the several sums of current money allowed to them respectively, as they appear to be settled and ascertained by the said journal of accounts, out of any money now in the treasury, or that shall come into the treasury subject to the appropriation of the General Assembly.

CHAPTER 213.

A supplement to an act, entitled, an act to reduce into one the several acts of assembly respecting elections, and to regulate said elections.

SEC. 1. Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland, That in case of an election for delegates, or a delegate or representative in Congress to fill a vacancy, the warrant for such election shall go to the sheriff of the county or counties where the election is to be held, who shall appoint the day for the holding of the same, of which eight days notice at least shall be given (exclusive of the day of notice, and the day of election) by such sheriff by advertisements set up at the most public places within each district of the County or Counties, under a penalty of fifty dollars.

2. And be it enacted, That the said sheriff shall serve a copy of the said warrant, together with notice of the day appointed for holding said election on each of the judges in each district at least three days before the day appointed for holding such election, under the penalty of ten dollars for each and every neglect, and such election shall be holden within fifteen days after the said warrant shall be received by the sheriff to whom the same shall be directed.

3. And be it enacted, That the thirty-fifth Section of the act to which this is a supplement, be, and the same is hereby repealed.
