conceive unduly Elected which Warrant Ensueth in his Verbis Viz

These are in the name of the Right Honourable the Lord Proprietor
to Will & require you to summon the Freemen of St Mary's County -
forthwith or as soon as possible to Elect & chuse three able & discreet men
to serve as Burghesses in the Assembly for that County & to make return
of this Warrant with the names of such Persons so Elected at furthest by
the Eighth day of March next Ensuing And for so doing this shall be your
Warrant Given at Mr Slys house the 3rd March 1659

Upon reading a Confirmation of certain Laws sent in by his
Lordship bearing date the 30th July Anno 1659 It was ordered that
the Laws thereunto Annexed with the Confirmation be sent to the Lower
House as also the Laws Confirmed in Anno 1650

together with a Commission for repeale of an Act formerly made at St
