Then was read an Act for setting up a Mint & sent to the Lower House. This day came Mr Thomas Winson & Mr Zachary Wade Burgees from the Lower House, desiring the Governour to sign a Warrant to give a Boat & Hands to carry the said Zachary Wade upon a present Employment, Whereupon (the Business being not signified upon which the said Wade was to be Employed) The Governour asked the Opinion of the Upper House whether the Warrant should be signed yea or No, & Resolved in the Negative till the Cause were known; Whereupon the Speaker came & said It was but for the Statutes of England

The Assembly is Adjourned till nine of the Clock to Morrow Morning at Mr Syles House.
