Then was read the Act for conveying of all Letters concerning the
State & publick Affairs

Which was voted unanimously to pass

Then was read the Act prohibiting Trade with Indians for Beefe or
Pork, voted by the House an unnecessary Act

Then was read an Order concerning the drawing of all the Acts in
force in this Province for every respective County Court

Voted that the transcribing of the old Laws now upon Record is a
perquisite due unto the Secretary & cannot be granted from him

The Act for repeal of the Act for Customs having passed the house
as it is now penned & presented requires a further time of Consideration &
therefore is referred till to morrow morning

The Upper House Adjourns till nine of the Clock in the morning

Wednesday the first of May

Present as yesterday

Then was read an Act for the repeal of the Act for Customs & another Act
for the Support of the Government Which was Voted by the whole house to
pass. The Judgment of the Lower house upon Hugh Lees Petition being
sent to the Upper house is referred till next Conference

Upon the reading of a Bill presented by the Lower house concern-
ing maintenance for Ministers.

It was voted to be altogether insufficient & short of the Thing aimed at

The Lower House desiring a Conference with the Upper House, it
was admitted of

Then was read the Act for Port Dutys touching Masters of Ships &
voted by the whole House to pass

The House Adjourns till nine of the Clock to morrow morning
