to pray for your Honour & Prosperity

Ordered that the said Duke do forthwith go to the Lower house & ask par-
don for his Fault & that the Clerk of the Lower house be desired to see his Submis-
sion recorded in their Journall

Then came Pappimmun Patkade Hunt & Dutwick & said they have a
Desire & hope to live at Choptico

Whereupon the Lieutenant General ordered that this should be asked them viz
Why they feared they should be putt off? Answered that Doct^r Barber & the
Sons of Mr Thomas Hatton would have it

It was then asked the Indians whether they were willing to let them
have it or no?

To which Pappimmun answered It was his desire but the rest of the
Indians would not consent to it

Paccakehunt desired they might live there they having no other place to go to
Ordered that the Indians deliver all writings between them & the
Sons of Tho. Hatton back again & that they be permitted to live at Choptico
without Disturbance they fencing in their Grounds from Cattle horses &
that all Papers & Contracts concerning this Land be void

The Lower House went to desire to know whether Robt^r Burle might
not be admitted to sitt with them again

The Lieuten^t General left it to their discretions

The Upper House Adjourned till nine of the Clock to Morrow Morning

Saturdaysth April Present all as before

The House sent Mr Lloyd to the Lower house to know whether they had any
Business prepared for this House?

Answer being returned that they have not drawn up any yet they having
some other Business to consider on

Ordered that the House be adjourned till
Monday at nine of the Clock in the morning
