An Act Concerning Proceedings at Law

Whereas several differences do arise within this Province wherein there is no Rule or Law provided in the Province whereby to determine such differences & to leave too much to discretion is to open a gap to corruption. For the avoiding such inconveniences be it enacted by the Lord Proprietary by & with the consent of the Upper & Lower Houses of this present General Assembly that in all cases where the Law of this Province is silent Justice shall be administered according to the Laws & Statutes of England if pleaded & produced this Act to endure for three years or to the end of the next General Assembly.

The Upper house desires to be satisfied how the County Courts shall be satisfied when the Law of England is rightly pleaded & whether all Laws of England how inconsistent soever with a Plantation shall be admitted here.
