

Then was read an Act prohibiting Arrests upon the Sabbath Days & days of Generals Musters & Training, ordered that these words be inserted (viz) provided also that it be lawful for any Sheriff to arrest any person or persons at a mustering day that is not bound to attend that Muster there to exercise & train, & that it be subscribed the Upper House have assented & that it be sent to the Lower House for their assent also

Then was read an Act for Attorneys for Business out of England The Upper House think it not fit to pass the latter Clause of this Act concerning Attorneys out of England for this reason viz. the person presented is liable to any arrest or Imprisonment for any such unjust molestation & further it would deter any person to seek for his own imprisonment in the Province tho' never so just for fear lest he find no Acquittance to be his Security.

Then was read an Act for the Erecting a Pillory Stocks & Ducking stool in every County of this Province

Ordered that this Act be subscribed The Upper House have assented. Ordered that the Speaker be desired to expedite the Act for more certain payment of the publick Levy

The Act for punishment of Contempt in Court by not standing uncovered &c.

The Act for punishment of such as scratch out marks &c. and dispose of tithes of tithes seized upon by the Sheriff &c.

Upon the Petition of Col Evans for pay for 20 men for attending the Lieutenant General to Choptico 4 days besides 5 powder & twenty pound of shot

Ordered that the Petition be endorsed thus viz We conceive it not fit to bring the Province in debt on this Act. the powder & shot excepted. Upon the Petition of Randall Stanon for pay for 30 men for 4 days &c. & 4<sup>th</sup> powder

Ordered likewise that the Petition be endorsed thus viz We conceive it not fit to bring the Province in debt upon this account the Powder excepted

And the House Adjourned till 9 of the Clock to morrow morning

September the 24<sup>th</sup> Present as before

Then was read the Act for quietting Possessions of Land &c. the Sense of the Upper House again endorsed on the backside thereof & sent to the Lower House viz

Least the Lower House should through misunderstanding precipitate this Act, which if it pass in terminis may seem to our neighbours & other persons in England injurious the Upper House have thought fit to explicate their meaning & send this Act once more to the Lower House for their Consideration viz they desire that all persons that have held Lands &c. as in the
