For every Sloop that shall come from Virginia shall not bring a Certificate that they belong to some Ship there that hath given Bond according to the Act for navigation and increase of Shipping the same Fees as for a Ship. But in case they do produce such Certificate to go free without paying Fees

Then was read again that Act Entituled an Addition to & Amendment of that Act for Secretarys Fees which is as follows

An Addition to Amendm^t of the Act for Secretarys Fees
 The Burgesses taking into Consideration this present Assembly the Act made Anno 1662 touching Secretarys Fees & not being sensible of any Detriment accruing either to the Masters of Ships or Masters or others thereby do think it convenient & necessary that the Act remain with the Addition of this Clause viz. that any Master or Purser of any Ship or Vessel that shall conceal any Person or Persons imported into this Province whereby the Secretary may be defrauded of his Fees shall forfeit five shillings in Money to the Secretary for every Person so concealed upon proof made Be it therefore ^{made by} the Lord Proprietary by & with the Consent of the Upper & Lower House of this present Assembly that the Act for Secretarys Fees with the Addition afo^r do stand & be in full force excepting that Clause in the forsaid Act which saith (and the said sum to be repaid to the Masters or Commanders by the Freighters or Owners of such Servants) be repealed & be it repealed by the Authority afo^r that Act with this Addition or Amendment to endure for three Years or to the End of the next General Assembly

After reading of which Resolved that it be put to the Vote whether it pass yea or no?

Mr Wateman his Opinion is that without the Amendm^t it ought not to pass

upon the motion from the Lower House to have the Act for quietting possessions again reassumed Ordered that it be sent to the Lower House for their Consideration
