

Upon reading the Act for depositing 20000 in the Lieutenant Generals Hands and finding it to be for the management of a War or purchasing a peace with our Indian Enemy inhabiting without the province

The House judge it that It will not answer the end to which it was designed & therefore referred it to a Conference with both houses

Upon the Act for seating all Lands in Baltimore County

The way prescribed in this Act for seating Plantations in Baltimore County is judged prejudicial to the Inhabitants of that County inasmuch as it obliges them to keep three Servants above 16 Years old upon their plantations which many of them are not able to do, besides that they have allowed too short a time to sail in after the 25th March 1655 & an unseasonable time of the Year

The House Adjourned till to morrow Morning Nine of the Clock

Then was read an Act against Exportation of Wool & old Iron and Assented unto

Then was read an Act for repeal of a Clause of an Act made the 23rd October 1640 by Leonard Calvert Esq Lieutenant General Entituled an Act for Servants Cloths & assented unto

Then was read an Act for the Administration of Justice Assented unto

Then was read an Act for the Surveyour Generals fees Assented unto.
