hanna that your Honours may hear the more true & certain
Intelligence of the Enemys proceedings prayeth

That your Lordships this honorable Assembly will take it
into your more serious Considerations the Premises considered &
grant him leave to be absent from attending as Burgess this
present Sessions of Assembly

Which petition a^d was granted by this House ordered to be sent
to the Lower House

Upon Consideration had of the defence of the Province
against the Incursion of the Indians Ordered that the original
Articles with the Susquehanna Indians be brought into this house
to morrow morning to be considered of.

Mr White being sick desired leave to depart the house, & made
his proxy the honourable the Lieutenant General

The House Adjourned till to morrow morning nine of the Clock
Wednesday the 14th September 1664

Then was tendered by the Chancellor the Articles of Peace with
the Susquehanna Indians according to the order yesterday

The House Adjourned till two of the Clock in the afternoon

And the House met again as before

Then Mr Richard Preston preferred a petition on the behalf of Wm
Lowry who had his servant Arthur imprisoned for Felony touching
the Fees of his said Imprisonment to be paid by the Country which
by the Sheriffs account amounts to 1550^l 10s^o
