Upon the consideration of the answer to the Lower House: to the paper sent yesterday from this House touching the performance of the articles with the S<sup>u</sup>gquehannahs in order to the security of the Province & people thereof in general from the incursions of our Enemies, they do not conceive that they have sufficiently provided for the End aimed at in providing so slender a number of men tho' at so great an Expence as those ten men may prove they only being able to induce the S<sup>u</sup>gquehannahs to employ as small a number in securing the heads of all the Rivers on the Western & Eastern Shore

Wherefore this House doth once more desire the Lower House to reassume the Debate & lay the common security to heart & sufficiently provide for it
