Resolved that the Lower House be invited to come into the Upper House to a Conference

- 1. That at the Conference the Chancellor to understand what the main that is coming upon these last proceedings of theirs
- 2. By leaving the Business without Law
- 3. The People discontented & jealous that their just Liberty were invaded when in truth the only intention that just power was used which the King hath given him by his Charter & is very commensurable to the people
- 4. The grievance much in Debt & particular Grievance much damage in several Colonies especially for want of their pay from the publick at which they have much reason to be discontented by their State relating to the last year's duty
- 5. The inconvenience of the raising the Spanish Charge
- 6. The inconvenience of putting the business in question to them that they want to know that their petitioners be provided in the Commons in the Parliament of England, for that they have no power to meet but by virtue of my Lord's Charter, so that if they in any way infringe that they put themselves for of no Charter as if they, the signing no privilege
- 7. That their answer is but like the answer Council of the City of London when if they act contrary to the resolution of the Mayor of the City or in violation of the Charter of the City
