

Attachments and Executions ordered to be read again the third time

Was read the Act for Limitation of Actions being read the second time ordered that it be read the third time to morrow morning

The House adjourned till nine of the clock in the morning

Friday the 7th May 1674 Present as before

The Chancellor informs the House that the Indian Murderer of Capt. Alder by name Anatchcom alias Wiccoman was brought prisoner last night to St. Marys and withal tendered this following Letter from the Lords and General to the Upper House

Gentlemen

You have here sent you the Indian that murdered Capt. Alder it is that Rogue that caused our late Troubles Ababeco Indians have brought him by order from their King Ababeco Mr. Henry Cursey knows the Indian & says of me that this is the Fellow that shot the said Alder and a little Indian that I have declared that this same Indian killed one other English man in her fight I do hereby order that this Murderer be executed at St. Marys to morrow that you make the Cursey happy to gratify the said Ababeco for his good service which will encourage the rest of our Friend Indians to do us the like service. The Indians that go along with the prisoner are some of Ababeco's Council

The names of the 4 men that guarded the Indian from the Eastern Shore

George Hogg Humphrey James John Stephens Tho. Flowers

Ordered that George Hogg have 300^l the rest 200 apiece

The Cursey being demanded his name answered it was Anatchcom a Wiccoman Indian

Being demanded where the rest of the Wiccoman lived He answered that they lived a small way from the head of North-
west River

The Cursey said he was the only Wiccoman that went to Dawson

The Cursey said that it was his Wife that was killed at the house of Mr. Cursey in Talbot County

The Cursey was in Company with them that killed Capt. Alder and says that he is the man that killed him but is in danger of losing his life concerning the manner of the Murder

Wiccoman testified that the prisoners have present killed
