

And for their further Satisfaction Desire the Upper house to send a Message of their own to this house to acquaint them what they think fit to be done in this Business upon which this house will further Consider and return their Resolve to the Upper house accordingly —

Ordered that Mr. Chew go to the Lower house and satisfy them what he knows Concerning the said Petition of Richard Suthman Voted that the Honourable Chancellor and Secretary go to the Lower house to offer the Reasons of this house why it is necessary that the Indians should have the Land of Billings by Alloted them and to desire that they would further Consider of it

The following Desire and Vote of the Lower house signified to this house By Mr. Loyd Viz^t. the Act Prohibiting the Importation of Horses Geldings and Mares & read and Voted by this house that it be revived, and that his Excellency and the Upper house be Desired to Concurr with them therein that his Excellency would be Pleased to grant no more Licences to any Person whatsoever for the Importation of any Horses & upon any Pretence and that his Excellency would be Pleased to supersede his Licences for that Purpose to Captain Hugh Oneale —

Voted that this house do Concurr with the Lower house in the said Vote Provided only that it shall be Lawfull for the Governor to Licence any of the Inhab. itants in Virginia, whether sent hither by the Order of the Government there, or coming upon their own Private Occasions to Import their Horses into this Province which are to remaine here no longer then During their Attendance upon the said Publick or private Business —

Read in the Lower house the Act touching Court Days and Voted to be repealed —

Act for Extent of Attachments read and to be Repealed

Act Touching Payment of Debts read and to be repealed

Act Touching Pagans read and to be repealed

Act against Fugitives read and to be repealed, and that a new Law be made that no Person Transport any Person free man or others out of this Province without a Pass under the hand of the Governor of this Province, then that such Person that so Transports any Person out of the Province shall be liable to pay all the said Persons Debts he so Transports out of the Country and in Case any Person Transports a Servant then to satisfy such Servants Master his Damages that he shall make appear against him —

Ordered that upon reading the Act for Secretaries fees & consent to the Upper House to desire that they would Concurr with this house in Repealing all Laws for Secretaries fees & that a new Law be made for the same

Act providing what shall be good Evidence upon Oaths & Specialties coming out of England and other Parts, and also the same what shall be good Evidence to prove Foreign Debts both read, & Voted
