The Lieutenant General having received this Day a Petition subscribed by some Members of both houses as also by several others of the County of Saint Maries and having likewise received there with an Obligation signed and Sealed by some of the Subscribers of the aforesaid Petition for the performance of that which he requested upon a Vote from the Lower house Touching a State house Office and Prison to be erected of Brick at the Countrys Charge so which request no answer as yet being returned in writing the Governor therefore hath Considered the aforesaid Petition and doth signify to the Lower house that he makes choice of the Town Land at St. Maries for the aforesaid Buildings and doth Desire that the Lower house will Proceed in the Ordering and Directing how it shall be Erected & this house is ready to Join with them therein —

His Excellency taking into his serious Consideration the Petition and Mediation of the Lower house in the Behalf of Pope Alvey doth signify to the Lower house that upon their request and Desire he doth Willingly Condescend to grant the said Alveys Petition and that the said Alvey sue out his Lordships Pardon.

Upon Notice given by this house that they are Ready to Join in a Conference touching the Indians the Lower house with their Speaker came to this house, and after some Debate the Question was put to both Houses whether it be necessary that a Peace be concluded between the Lynicoes Indians and the English Resolved in the affirmative Nemine Contradictentes and that the manner thereof and Articles for the same be Considered of by this house and Transmitted to the Lower house —

In pursuance of the Vote for a Peace to be made with the Lynicoes Indians passed at a conference of Both houses, this Day the Upper house have Voted that a Peace be by the Governor made with the said Lynicoes Indians and forasmuch as that Peace may bring a Warr with the Susquehannaks this house for the Security of the Province do Vote
