Resolved as in the Morning together with the Honble Secretary
Ordered that upon Complaint made against William Boyden of
Parker County in the Pipe-Cattaway Indians, that for Jesse Wharton take
good Security of the said Boyden for his civil and Peaceable behaviour against
the said Indians and that the said Boyden shall render such Satisfaction to the
said Indians for the Injuries done them by him as shall be by the next Provincial
Court adjudged reasonable — Signed Ye

This house desired the Lower house to consider a Petition Exhibited to
this house by Joe Snake an Indian who hath been and is like to be servicable
to the English — Signed Ye

Lower house 24th May 1676 —

Voted in this house that it is necessary and fit that the said Indian
have a House or more which he shall select & own him — Signed Ye

Ordered by the house that Matchcoats Iron powder and Shot be
purchased and forthwith Delivered to the friend Indians by way of
Gratification for the Services done by the said Indians in the late War
against the Inguahannah Indians, and that the said Matchcoats be
distributed to the number and in the manner as followeth. Viz^t —

And powder & shot be Distributed to the Quantity & in the manner following
