

But if lost nothing to be paid for him —

To the last three Articles that his Lordship or the Governour for the time being (upon any Occasions to prep Provisions) will please to appoint two Sufficient Persons in every hundred to impress all manner of Provisions and other Necessaries for the Supplying any Party sent out by his Lordship according as his Lordship shall think fit and that the Respective Sheriffs and other Officers to be assisting to such Prep makers —

Charles James having due Notice given him to prepare for his Tryall this Morning being called did make his appearance, and the Articles of Impeachment against the said James being read and after this the several Depositions thereto Annexed which also were sworn to by the several and Respective Deponents in the Presence and hearing of the said Charles James M^r Penelton Chyldene and Col William Burges according to a Preceding order of the Lower house did Manage the said Impeachment and urge the several Evidences against the said Charles James —

Whereupon this house do Judge it fitt that Charles James be Disabled to Bear any Publick Office or Employment and have therefore Desired his Lordship to Call in the said James his Commission for Sheriff of Ceit County which his Lordship hath accordingly done
