Ordered also that there be such and so many of the Neighbouring
Indians of the Several Nations present at the said Examination as shall be
thought fit to Satisfie and assure the said Neighbouring Indians that no-
Wrong or Injustice shall at the Present or for the Future be done them.

Came here by Order of this house on Saturday last John Dmune for &
Mary Gilman Exec of Richard Gilman Deed Plaintiff in the Will of her
here depending against John Quigly Defendt and the Defendants Demurred to
the Errors assigned being fully Argued on both Sides it was found that there was
a Misprision of the Clerk in Entering of the Special Baile given by Blackhall
in the Provincial Court and this house being of Opinion that the said Mis-
prision might have been Amended in the Provincial Court itself by the
Judges there within a certain time it was Ordered here that the Record be
brought into this house to be amended in Point of Special Baile aforesaid which
was done Accordingly and therefore it is considered here that the Baile be discharged
the Parties Dismissed each paying their own Costs and that nothing of this Pro-
ceeding be intended to Destroy the Judgment in the Provincial Court against the
Principall Blackhall
