

They cannot consent to the leaving out the words in the latter end of the fifth article in the said Bill begining / we his Lordships most humble Servants the Members of because they are the very words of the Vote of the Lower house this very Assembly and the only words that Sufficiently assure his Lordship of the Payment of the Charge of the Warre, neither doth these words oblige the Magistrates to serve beyond the Intent of the last Law the clause ending in

Such Methods and Proportions as by this Act is limited and Provided

If the Proprietary or his Lieut: and Council have not power by this Act to pay the pensions of Widows and Orphans of the slain Soldiers, by the words of the old Act, they cannot pay one single Widow even out of the 50000 of Soldiers they are empowered to levy yearly, but must call an Assembly to do it, or permitt her to starve till an assembly can be called.

So as above this house are willing to pass the Act, and if the Lower house think fit they may proceed to ingrossing the Bill.
