by the said Henry Hardy against the said Philip Synes in the Provincial Court be fair
for the only relation to the writs allowed to the said Hardy is and is hereby reversed -
Reversed and Annulled and that the said Philip Synes be unto the said writs -
and also recover against the said Henry Hardy the sum of Sixty pounds of Silver
for Damages by him sustained with his costs and Charges by him laid out & Expended
in the prosecution of his Writ of Error brought since the Dissolution of the last Assembly.
