

Goods delivered to Indians this house know not by what Order or upon what or whose account the said Goods were advanced and therefore cannot allow the said Article till satisfied thereon

To the Article of 1000 of Tobacco allowed to several persons Nov 9. 23 This house do approve the same to be in error in that the said 1695 ought to be 1805 so that there is mistaken 1500 Lbs. more to be added to the said Account

To the Article of 2500 Tobacco to Mr Anthony Underwood this house do not think fit to charge the publick with any more Tobacco than any Member of assembly is at present allowed to have in his private house to the Use then of the Country and Disengagement of publick Tobacco when being not desired thereon, and if private Tobacco is sold for private Use they have the same right therefore we are not to be concerned in it

To the Article of 1000 of Tobacco allowed to Thomas Dakins Door keeper this house do approve the same by the same Article granted this house conceive the same to be a great Burden upon the Country for Twelve Months time especially when they find that such Tobacco is carried to Anthony Evans a private Person who is a great Consumer of Tobacco of which is 2800 Lbs. for every Year and that such Tobacco has served the publick in a private manner

To the Article of 1000 of Tobacco allowed to Thomas Beale in consideration of the same he is to be allowed to keep it in his house and in his Room, this house do approve the same because he is a husband to the said Beale that is worthy and necessary to him and therefore we by no means approve of the said Charge if he is not able to pay the same done in his house for any amount in his house

The same is a Burden upon the Country and accounts and this house do approve the same done to the House by Mr Clement Hill which has not been done before

This house do approve and give leave of the Report of the Committee for settling the publick Accounts of the Province and do well approve of their Allowances and necessary Expences for their Offices and Instruments

To the Article of 1000 of Tobacco allowed to Mr Baker in the said Account because this house cannot understand of any more to be members of that Committee in future

That Mr Baker was to be taken down for it is ever much he having been at no time in standing or taken any pains therefore this house Vote him an Allowance of 5000 of Tobacco for such his attendance and no more

That Mr Baker having preached five Sermons to this Assembly be allowed an Allowance of 1000 of Tobacco and Mr John Walker having preached one Sermon be allowed an Allowance of 500 of Tobacco the same as is ordered by the Committee to be done

That Mr Walker be allowed 500 of Tobacco for his Entertainment of the
