John Bennet's petition sent

The Bill for deposition of the State house appointed sent also all the above matters sent on Monday morning and to the Lower house this house are willing presently to confer with the Lower house about adjournment. He returns and says several of the Members of the Lower house are Irish men and they stay only for that message and will adjourn

Mr. Jones from the Lower house and says the Lower house will confer with this house to morrow morning

This house adjourns till to morrow morning 8 of the Clock
