that Mr. Carter by reason of the want of Behaviour of the Ships Company —  
abstaining from him his Companions their confining him to his cabin, and depriving  
him of his common Rites & Raps for his Support of Succour and Refreshment —  
on Board in time of his Sickness, came to an untimely and unnatural end —

Care shall be strictly and diligently enquired after by all Magis-  
trates or others living with or near such Passengers by whom the truth  
thereof may be the better known & to do justice therin —

The last Message from the house by Mr. Hammon and Mr. Bridgeman expressing  
they had no mind to this peace they could but signify their resolution that  
no matter too much intervening on the Prorogation of the King in whose power  
it is to make peace or war, and that consequently the Board lately concluded  
to dispossess the Governor with the advice and consent of his Council judiciorum  
sufficient of its self without the help of an Act or Law to express the same, and  
however it will be no further urged; this Board being desirous rather to put  
it to the mistake here design of the house in meeting the same and if the house  
desire to pursue the articles made for their information they may at request have  
copies thereof sent them. —
