ques Some of them to his knowledge have been out and straglers this four or five years  
and that he asked them, when they designed to return home, and they told him as soon  
as the heat was over (for they were afraid of our Brangars abroad and kept loose) they  
would back into the Country and so that way homewards. But the said Jacob Young  
further advises and assures their honours that the best and most certain intellig:  
ence can be expected must be from Albany for he can get nothing out of our Indians

Taken into Consideration the good Services done by Jacob Young to this  
Country and what he may yet do, and how capable he is of so doing; It is the  
Opinion of this Board that he ought to be encouraged and therefore Resolved to -  
Recommend the same / with proposall of Gratitude / to the Assembly at laying the  
Savv. which passed into an Order of this Board as follows Viz:

In Consideration of many good Services Mr. Jacob Young hath done and  
performed to this Province, and his readiness always therein, also how much  
further serviceable he may yet be in the present juncture Resolved that the  
same may be by this Board Recommended to the Assembly at the next laying the  
Savv and a suitable sum proposed for a gratuity to be made to the said Jacob Young
