

Walter Nicholas will by his petition pray allowance for three Houses  
 paid for him in the term of the late Revolution for his Majesty's Service  
 and made use of for some considerable term one of them the best and  
 his own Particular Riding House as professedly abused that soon after was  
 returned home dead his Family Provision and his Hay Vales and  
 Straw Sold for his Cattle and other Creatures all destroyed and devalu-  
 ed by the Guards quartered upon him and by that means his stock aban-  
 doned and much impaired for all which he humbly prays the Conse-  
 deration of this Board and the Assembly in order to make him such  
 reasonable Reparation as they shall think fit

The said petition thus answered and subscribed viz

By the Governor and Council in Assembly

May the 31 1692

Appearing to this Board that the Damages layd in the Peti-  
 tion were occasioned by Breach of Articles after the Surrender and Oc-  
 casioned by himself they can not think of any Redression however  
 the Act of Indemnity reaches this Province but if the Petitioner think  
 fit he may apply himself to the Assembly

A Petition preferred to his Excellency from the Inhabitants of  
 Saint John's praying that as formerly they have been they may  
 be reduced and reduced to a peculiar and particular County of them  
 whereby willing and able to bear and defray their own incidental  
 Charges of holding Courts and all other the duties of a County  
 His Excellency having communicated the same to this Board they  
 refer it to the consideration of the House who if they think fit may  
 prepare a Bill accordingly

James Bennet of Saint Mary's County who married the widow  
 and Heir of Thomas Sen died by his petition humbly prays allow-  
 ance for two years Salary due to his Predecessor as Publick Post employed  
 for the County as also for the use of a House and the Loss of a Servant  
 wholly by the said Sen his sickness deputed to Officers and run away  
 away with his Horse some Clothes &c and the Horse for several months  
 after not heard of He is recommended and hath Liberty to apply him-  
 self to the House of Assembly who are better acquainted with the Na-  
 ture of the petition and have proper Cognizance thereof

Joseph Tully's Petition to the House praying to be relieved  
 from a decree in Chancery bearing date in the year 1680 surreptitiously  
 obtained against him by one George Suter and his Estate thereupon  
 seized and imbeziled and he himself a prisoner under Close Confinement
