It appearing to the Board that the damages laid in the Peti-
tion were occasioned by Breach of articles after the Surrender and Oc-
caisioned by himself the year next before of any Revolution however
the Act of Indemnity reaches this place not but if the petitioner think
fit he may apply himself to the Assembly

I. Petition preferred to their Excellency from the Inhabitants of
Saint Island praying that as formerly they have been they may
be reduced and restored to their peculiar and particular County of them
abreasting willing and able to bear and defray the summe incident
Charges of holding Courts and all other the dues of a County
His Excellency having communicated the same to this Board they
refer it to the consideration of the House who if they think fit may
prepare a Bill accordingly

James Brown of Saint Marys County who married the widow
and wife of Thomas Pen dale by his petition humbly prayes albow
and further yours. Salary due to his predecessor as Postleth Post employed
for the County as also for the use of a Horse and the Logis of a Servant
wholly by the said Pen dale which is disputed to be a Postleth and run away
away with his Horse some Clother and the Horse for several months
after not heard of him recommended and hath liberty to apply him-
self to the House of Assembly who will be acquainted with the fa-
ctes of the petition and have proper ignorance thereof
