Assembly now convened and met together having seriously and maturely  
perused considered debated and Enquired into the several Articles of Impeach-  
ment or Charge Exhibited by your Agents against the Lord Baltimore and his  
Deputies do upon strict Search thereof and the several Depositions Exa-  
minations Papers and Records thereof find the same to be Punctually &  
Exactly true according to the several parts thereof now by us abridged &  
hereunto annexed the which we are able ready and willing to prove defend  
and maintain by such further Testimony proofs and evidences as may  
be reasonably required of us whensoever your Majesty shall please to call  
us thereunto By your Royal Commission of Enquiry into the Premises  
and not only so but several Insolencies Misdemeanors & Outrages done  
and perpetrated since by his Factors and Agents here to the disturbance  
of your Majestys good and loyal Subjects. Inhabitants hereof aiming at  
and designing nothing less then total Subversion of this your Government  
and your Majestys Royal Authority over us which they have as much as  
in them lay endeavored to Obliterate and Case out of the minds of your  
Majesty most loyal Subjects

The Money of 2<sup>d</sup> of the said Act of Assembly bestowed in his Lordship  
for the support of Government and the contingent Charges thereof  
We likewise find to be misapplied, and that his Lordship the Lord Bal-  
timore in Areas indebted to the Country as or seven and thirty thousand
