This House has by appointment a Committee to prepare a Supplement to the Bill for the amendment of the said Act in relation to the said Act if they have any propositions or other matters before them relating thereto they may be transmitted to this House for the perusal of the said Bill

Ordered by this House that no one shall be permitted to come and speak at the Appointment of the Speaker nor to be interrupted by any other member the penalty of a fine at the discretion of the House but that every person speaking in person shall be heard of every matter debated in the House

Brought into this House and reads follows viz

William Blankenship aged 24 years or thereabouts deposed as follows

That Mr Jacob Young is a merchant near Bangall Over his Body Broken out with Boils and Sores that he is altogether incapable of going or being carried upon any Journey or Voyage without apparent danger of his life which is humbly Certified to his Lordship and the upper House of Assembly
