

Articles of Naturalization of Peter Byard Arnoldus de la Guirge & Peter  
Hayter and Susport Paures signed as follows viz  
April 24<sup>th</sup> 1684

The Lower House have Assented

Together with the following Message  
Lower House of Assembly April 24<sup>th</sup> 1684

Upon reading the several Bills of Naturalization of these several Persons  
therein named this house have considered that there hath been usually paid  
to the Speaker of the House of Commons in England a considerable sum for  
the passing of any Private Act this House have seriously debated the  
same have resolved

That all Persons that shall be Naturalized this present Session of Af-  
sembly do respectively pay unto the Speaker of this House the sum of twelve  
hundred Pounds of Tobacco for the fees of their naturalization and that the  
like fee be paid to the Speaker of the Upper House for the future

And that the fee of the Clerk of the Lower House may be three hundred  
Pounds of Tobacco for every naturalization and no more

And this House desire the concurrence of the Upper House herein

Upon reading the Bill for reviving the Temporary Laws of this Province  
this House do say that the words [so far as the Court shall judge them not  
inconsistent with the Condition of this Province which is not to stand revived]  
Relating to the Act concerning Proceedings at Law ought to be erased out  
of the said Bill And the Act for killing Wolves is a perpetual law so made  
Anno 1676 and cannot properly be brought into a Bill of Revival but if  
both Houses shall deem the said Act unnecessary or of no use the same ought  
to be repealed

This to be considered and accordingly provided for by the Lower House  
in the Reviving Act before this House can think of passing the same so  
Absolutely Contrary to the Result of his Lordship's upon sound Reasons given  
to this House and Communicated to the Lower House in a W. of J. from  
hence yesterday

The Lower House is desired to have their Assent to the Bill for  
Naturalization of Jacob Seth / my perfectly sent up to this House: now pass  
by Express and returned to this House
