That whereas it is known that great delays have been
caused and persons put to great Expence and Charge and Repairs
of their Debts by reason of Appeals and writts of Error brought from
the County Courts to the Provincial Court of this Province it is
proposed that a Law be made to prevent such delays if possible

That no Action shall be commenced in the Provincial Court
unless the Cause of Action exceed the Sum of twelve hundred Pounds
of Tobacco and that no Appeal shall lye from the County Courts to
the Provincial unless the debt and Damages exceed the Sum of Twelve
hundred pounds of Tobacco

That an equal Number of Itinerant Justices of the Court
be appointed on each side the Bay as at that they are the Cir-
cuits in the Matter of Judges of Assizes in England every year as often
as they shall think fit and that a Provincial Office be kept on each
Side the Bay likewise from whence all Process shall issue as for
merely the number of Justices and Salary left to the Consideration of the
House the Clerk on each side the Bay keeping the Provincial Office
Obliged to attend the said Justices in their Circuits and to transmit
the Record to the Office

That a Law be provided for to Appoint some certain time after
the Justices finishing their Circuits for the Governor and Council sitting
to hear all Appeals & writts of Error and that no Appeal lye from the
Provincial Court to the Governor and Council under the sum of 100
Sterling or 40000 of Tobacco nor from them to the King and Council
under the Sum of 300 Sterling pursuant to their Majesty's Royal
Instructions the thing appealed for to be Valued by the Court to be
worth such a sum otherwise the Appeal or Writ of Error not to
be Admitted

The Constituting of a Court of Chancery is left to the Consider-
ation of the House sending the following Paper for their Perusal
to Consult whether the Record shall be kept by the Clerk of the Provincial
or by a Particular Officer

That moderate fees may be settled where necessary
