

Given by his Excellency Sir Edmund Andros to returne Letters sent to  
know his Excellency's pleasure therein and to returne to his Excellency the Gov<sup>r</sup>  
of New York to signify to him that at present they could not give any further  
answer but would by express send by or before the first of May next

That at a Council held the 16 of April Anno 1694 at the Judges  
Court in the County the Council then met did actually send an Express to  
New York with Bills of Exchange unto Chudleigh Brooke Esq<sup>r</sup> Collector &  
Receiver of their Majestys Revenue in those parts to the Sum of 250.8.4  
Sterling in Compliance to her Sacred Majestys Commands which said Messen-  
ger delivered the same accordingly and brought back the said Collectors Receipt  
as by the Journal of the Council Recourse being thereunto had doth fully and  
at large appear and that since nothing further hath been done

Ordered that the same Letters and papers together with the right Honble  
Col<sup>l</sup> Andrew Hamiltons Letters here likewise read be sent to the House of Bur-  
geses for their Consideration the which was accordingly sent by Mr Tench  
together with a printed Book and the Proposals relating to the Election  
of Sheriffs

Who returns and says he delivered the same  
That the Act for Ordinary Keepers be Amended pursuant to his Ma-  
jesty's Order in Council of the 2 of March 1693 herewith sent

That no Person be suffered to carry any Cyder or other strong Liquors  
to any Indian Town or Station in Order to vend the same under penalty of being  
fined and forfeiting all such Liquors

The foregoing Proposals sent also by Mr Tench together with another  
of the 3 of October instanc<sup>t</sup> relating to the Election of Burgesses who comes &  
says he delivered the same

Mr Cheseldyn Captain Hammond Mr Ennals & Mr Feary came from  
the House with the following Message viz<sup>t</sup>

By the Assembly October the 6 1694

Resolved by the House that whereas your Excellency hath been Pleas'd  
to Communicate to the House their Majestys Instructions to you to require an  
Account of the sum of 12 £ paid for the Support of this Government  
from the Collectors of the same since the last Convention in this Province

Upon Consideration of which this House hath thought fit that two of  
the Members of this house with two of your Council with whom your Ex-  
cellency shall think fit to appoint to be a standing Committee to examine and  
audit the said Accounts
