of a Certain Statute of England made in the 12th year of King Charles
the Second's Reign Intituled an Act for the Encouraging & Encouraging
of Shipping and Navigation as by the said Act is Comanded
Enjoyned and Required we have thought it necessary to promote a
Certain Bill to this present General Assembly to be humbly offered to
their Majestys for their Royall Assent to confirm and satisfy all proce-
dings Judicial Military and Civil from the death of the said Governour
Copley to your Excellencys arrival to this Province

We therefore humbly move your Excellency not only to accept
of this our true and just Representation of the premises but that you
will be pleased to Sign with us who in all becoming and loyal Humi-

and loyal Hearts and Sincerity to their Service have permitted and
Consented to in the premises
