of Maryland upon the service of Col Copley and the death of Captain Francis
Hutchinson their Secundary Governor which treason he recited in the said
Committee questioning their first intention but put the question whether Sir
Edmond and the Board were satisfied wch my self assured that Col Nicholson
was dead upon which Question Sir Edmond seeming much uneasy Sir Thos
did further add that it was a proper Question for that if Sir Edmond had not
Committed Maryland with that Commission their Majestys Authority did
fully subsist in Maryland upon their Commission given to and executed by
Col Copley lately deceased and which in case of his death if no Person particu-
larly Commissioned by their Majestys did derive upon their Majestys Com-
mittee their Measure were further known but the members of their Majestys
Honble Council being Unanimously of Opinion that Sir Edmond has Committed
now ought notwithstanding to take place Sir Thomas did Acquiesce and then
hing it fit to consider any particular defens to the General Service of the Honble Board
least he might seem to shew a spirit of Opposition to the concurrent Opinion of the
Council and which he had under so Experienc'd a Government Sir Edmond Andros might
yet prove most Advantageous to their Majestys Service

Wherefore for whatsoever fault he may have committed by such his Com-
mittee he doth hereby Submit himself to his Majestys Judgment and most humbly beseeches
his pardon
