Read Act for Appeals &

We are of Opinion that the Appeals from the Provincial to the Governor
and Council ought to be not under 100 Sterling or 4000 Tobacco pursuant to
their Majesty's Instructions and that it be said according to their Majesty
Royal Commission and no further

The House being of Opinion that it will be of Service to the Country that
Appeals from the Provincial Court to the Governor and Council should be granted
for any sum amounting to 50 Sterling or 2000 Tobacco the Honble Council do
thereupon consent to the same

In the Act for ports we are of Opinion that Rehoboth be made a port and
Snow Hill a Town in Somerset County and that Yarmouth in Dorchester
County formerly a Town be again so appointed & Baltimore Town in Dorchester
County not convenient for a port

That a proviso be made for his Excellency to take up a lot in Inn Arundel
Town That the Lord Proprietaries name be named according to Patent

That in Inn Arundel Town there be a place set aside for a Synagogue

In said Act Folio 13 Line 14 Ships to load and unload at ports only but
may have Liberty to sell any where Folio 15 that persons may have Liberty to buy
and sell in any place that a certain number of dwelling houses and Warehouses
be provided for according as has been formerly remitted and that the last proviso
in the said Act be wholly left out

Act for Imposition of 4 Gallons Folio 1 Line 2's that Clause about discourag-
ment of Officers &c to be left out Folio 2 That all liquors imported from Pennsylvania
shall pay 8 Gallons with severe penalty on the persons importing such
liquors with the loss of the same Folio 3 Penalty and forfeiture must go without
